Expansion of the Free Conservation Kit Program

Starting July 1st, 2024, Arizona Water Company (AWC) expanded its Free Water Conservation Kit Program to all service areas. This program was piloted in the eastern service areas with wild success. Thanks to a grant from the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA), the expansion of this program has been fast-tracked.
